Justification of the problem taking into account the baseline situation in the project region	Bobruisk district is one of the largest districts of the Mogilev region. The area of the district is 1,600 square kilometers. The territory of the district includes 217 settlements, 16,500 people live in them. Stationary libraries of the GUK "Centralized Library Network of the Bobruisk district" are located in 14 settlements of the district, and residents of 195 settlements have limited access to use library services. Bookselling, library points as forms of library service are inferior to the capabilities of a mobile library, not allowing to fully provide high-quality library services to all segments of the population, while the bibliobus is designed to create a new social and communicative format for the life of local society and allows to reach the maximum number of residents of the Bobruisk district. Bibliobus allows you to bring information as close to the user as possible, to create favorable conditions for him to receive a library book. This is a good way for libraries to expand the scope

The envisaged objectives during the project work	expand the library space by serving remote and sparsely populated areas that do not have permanent libraries, by providing rural residents with unlimited access to information; increase the range of library services and introduce the most effective forms of public service; qualitatively improve the level of information literacy of residents of remote settlements; participation of the library as a socio-cultural institution of the state in solving problems of socially disadvantaged groups of the population; strengthen the social partnership of the library with public and other organizations dealing with the problems of socially disadvantaged sections of the population; increase the positive image of the library among the population: in advertising its services and opportunities.

Description of project activities	The Bibliobus will allow residents of the Bobruisk district to use information, service, and educational services, deliver new books to every home, and thus help overcome the differences in the cultural status of the city and the village.; The mobile complex can act as; an information center; a mobile library; a remote consulting and educational center; a children's center; a venue for holding seminars, master classes, and presentations; a mobile public reception office; a legal information center; a platform for teaching computer literacy; a center for access to information for people with disabilities; - a mobile center for providing public services to the population;
